PARISH SACRAMENTAL PROGRAM – RECONCILIATION - Our Parish will begin the Sacramental Programme next week with the Sacrament of First Reconciliation. Any child who is baptised in the Catholic Church and is in Grade 3 or above is eligible to participate in the programme and celebrate their First Reconciliation. The programme is family-based and parents take the responsibility of preparing their child to receive the sacrament. The parish tries to make the programme as user friendly as possible and it begins by inviting all parents to an information hour where they answer any questions and provide some education to help parents in their role of "handing on the faith" to their child. The Jesuit theologian and educator, Fr Richard Leonard, will provide some input on the night. The (one hour) Information Session takes place on Monday, February 17th, 7.00pm, at Sacred Heart church, Rosalie.

For those who cannot make the Monday night an additional preparation session is offered at the Atrium of the Good Shepherd, Rosalie on Saturday, February 22nd at 3pm. PARISH SACRAMENTAL PROGRAM – BAPTISM - The tradition of our Catholic Church has been to baptise children shortly after birth so that, from the start, they can grow up within the family of the Church. Occasionally, for many different reasons, a young child misses out on being baptised. Not wanting to diminish the importance of this sacrament, while, at the same time, wanting to provide some form of preparation so that the child understands what is happening, **the parish have traditionally run a preparation course (for older children) during Lent** so that baptism can be celebrated on Easter Sunday.



SCHOOL RENEWAL SURVEY Thank you to the families who have returned the survey that was included in last week's newsletter. Surveys are asked to be returned by Friday 14 February. Beginning next week the surveys will be collated and the relevant feedback, in conjunction with the broad 2012 – 2016 goals and the on-going actions from 2013 will be used to establish 2014 goals and actions. This process of discernment will be done in consultation with the school's Leadership Team, Jubilee Schools' Council, Father Peter and Brisbane Catholic Education. It would be my intention that this process is finalised as soon as possible so the School Renewal Plan for 2014 can be presented to the community.

WELCOME MARIST ASHGROVE YEAR 10 STUDENTS This Thursday we welcome five Year 10 Marist Ashgrove students who will work with the Year 3 class as part of their Leadership and Mentoring Program - LAMP. LAMP is one of the outreach opportunities under the MATES umbrella. MATES Ministry – (Marists are taking everybody seriously) is the Marist College Ashgrove's social justice and solidarity outreach program. At its heart it is about Faith, Relationship and Solidarity. It works on a model of compassion, service, and justice.

LAMP is in its 5th year of operation and works on the model of Year 10 boys, walking and working with younger students in the local Catholic Primary Schools. The Marist students visit on a weekly basis throughout term time, and work with students from the school – the ages and type of work/play activity is determined by our host school. The response to the program is overwhelming. The Marist boys enjoy the time spent with younger students and are given opportunity to engage with, listen to and support others.

CLASS NEWS

PREP LOVE - It's so wonderful to see such happy faces every morning in prep love. The children have settled in very well and this is only their second week. YEAR 1 LOVE - We have been working hard writing about our weekend, learning high frequency words and letter sounds, counting and writing numbers to 20 and making tigers to name just a few things. We have also been learning about the days of the week and enjoying writing in our handwriting books.



YEAR 1 FAITH - What a great start to the year for Year 1 Faith. It's been wonderful to hear of the adventures had during the break and see the return of smiling faces. Dragon our pet turtle has transitioned well after being in Prep for two years and is happy following many of his Prep friends up to the next grade.

There are many changes for the class and all are adapting well to increased writing and math. This week is our first for homework and spelling words. Everyone has been showing great effort at school to learn their spelling and I hope this enthusiasm has travelled home. Homework is due to be returned Friday when we will have our spelling test. This week all students are attempting the full list. Adjustments will be made over coming weeks to better suit their ability levels.

YEAR 2 CHARITY - Welcome back to all the Year 2's!

Everyone has settled in well and is getting back into the swing of school life after the holidays. We have started most of our units of work. In Science we are looking at growing and changing. We will investigate lifecycles and next week we will have some special visitors! In Maths we are revising our two-digit place value and will move on and look at three-digit place value.

Every week we will look at our school rule of the week, this week we are learning all about being responsible. We all hope we get a gotcha card while on the playground! We all look forward to a great term ahead!

YEAR 3 FAITH - Our Year 3 faith students have started the year with a big bang! We have been learning about space, and in particular, how and why we have night and day on Earth. A bit more locally, we have investigated the traditional people who lived in Ashgrove; the Turrbul people, and learnt a few indigenous words.

This week we are celebrating class Mass. Our theme is 'God is our Shepherd'. We love praising God for all that he does for us by singing with our angelic voices, reading with confidence and being respectful in God's house. We are looking forward to exploring the bible to see how people in the past have shown their love for God through songs, poems, stories and psalms.

YEAR 4 FAITH/CHARITY – All Year students have been very busy settling in to the year and preparing for "Boot Camp". Swimming began last week on Wednesday and will continue for the remainder of

the term. The students have been working out what the new school rules will mean for them and the St Finbarr's community. They created a personal shield showing their own ideas and then created a class shield that captured their ideas
